Oxfordshire County Council is reviewing Home Care Services (for example, washing, dressing, medication prompting service) it buys from providers in Oxfordshire. Neighbourhood policing- 16/5/19

Priorities

Burglary: A lawnmower was stolen from a shed in Sudbury Court, Faringdon. Please make sure your tools and garden machinery are locked away securely. Keep sheds in good condition and postcode mark all your tools as this will act as a deterrent and increase the chance of stolen items being returned.

There is also advice on how to avoid invalidating your home insurance through poor security and a handy checklist when going away. County Drug Lines: As a neighbourhood team we have been focusing on County Drug Lines.

We have been provided with intelligence that suggests dealers have been using Faringdon. County Drugs Lines is the name given to a type of drug dealing by organised crime groups (OCGs) who create a network between a city and a smaller town. A closure order has been obtained from the Magistrate's Court for a house in Faringdon where drug dealing is suspected to be taking place.

Anti-social behaviour (ASB): We received a report about a large group of football supporters in the town centre causing ASB. The Faringdon neighbourhood team attended, and with force wide support and assistance from Wiltshire police, ensured the peace was kept and that the supporters were moved on.

We have received numerous complaints that young people have been smoking cannabis. In response to this the team have been stop checking and searching young people who are believed to be linked to this. The neighbourhood team have been focusing on ASB moving people on and giving suitable words of advice to those involved. Acceptable Behaviour Contracts have been provided to those repeat offenders who must comply with the conditions listed on the contract.

Offenders brought to justice

Faringdon neighbourhood team received a call about suspicious activity in a local pub. The team attended and contained the area until other units arrived. Five arrests were made and a large sum of cash was seized along with drug related property Trailer thefts

We have had a small spate of trailer thefts in the local area, if anyone sees anyone acting suspiciously around properties or areas with trailers can this please be reported on 999. We would advise that trailer owners review their security. Trailer hitch locks and wheel locks are advisable and if possible use a vehicle to block the trailer in.

Active communities

• Faringdon neighbourhood team have been liaising with local parishes in moving forward with the community speed initiative to try and cut down on speeding through our small local villages.

• With Ramadan ongoing we will be focusing on supporting our local Muslim community during this time to ensure their wellbeing and safety.

• We will be arranging Have Your Say meetings so members of the public can come forward and talk about local concerns. The time and location will be placed on the TVP Facebook page.

OVO Energy Women's Tour professional cycling race Wed 12th June - 17/4/19

Henley-on-Thames will be the start location for stage three of the OVO Energy Women's Tour professional cycling race. Full details of the Oxfordshire route were revealed at a ceremony at the town's Leander Club – home to rowing greats like Sir Steve Redgrave CBE and Rebecca Romero – on Monday 15 April.

The famous South Oxfordshire town will host a Big Bike Breakfast on the morning of the race, Wednesday 12 June. Crowds will line the streets, cheering off participants on the 145 kilometre-leg that will finish outside Blenheim Palace in West Oxfordshire.

Elite cyclist Sophie Wright announced that Oxfordshire's race section will start from Market Place in the centre of Henley.

Oxfordshire's county, city and district councils announced last month that a stage of the OVO Energy Women's Tour, the UK's most prestigious women's cycle race, had been agreed to race through the county for the next three years, in partnership with event organisers SweetSpot Group.

From Henley, stage three will traverse the Chilterns via Pishill to Watlington, before returning via the climb of Britwell Hill to Sonning Common and Goring.

Crossing the River Thames at Wallingford, the route will pass through Didcot, Harwell and Wantage, crossing the Vale of White Horse to **Faringdon**, before looping through the West Oxfordshire towns of Burford, Charlbury and finally Woodstock in the closing kilometres. More details and map
