

Sir Gerald Hugh Tyrwhitt-Wilson, 14th Lord Berners

Born 18 September 1883, died 19 April 1950, age 66, unmarried

Sir Gerald Hugh **Tyrwhitt-Wilson**, 14th Lord Berners was born on 18 September 1883.

He was the son of Hon. Hugh Tyrwhitt and Julia Mary Foster.

Sir Gerald Hugh Tyrwhitt-Wilson, 14th Lord Berners was baptised with the name of Gerald Hugh Tyrwhitt. He was educated at Eton College, Eton, Berkshire, England.

He was Hon. Attaché to Constantinople and Rome between 1912 and 1919.

He succeeded to the title of *14th Lord Berners [E., 1455]* on 5 September 1918. He succeeded to the title of *5th Baronet Tyrwhitt-Jones, of Stanley Hall, Shropshire [U.K., 1808]* on 5 September 1918.

On 31 March 1919 his name was legally changed to Gerald Hugh Tyrwhitt-Wilson by Royal Licence.

music for the film *The Half-Way House* (1944).

On his death, his baronetcy became extinct.²
