WULPEN CHURCHYARD**



Tony Pepall was a comrade of Jack Bryan. He was killed by a sniper when driving an Officer scouting the German positions on May 30th 1940. The Officer played dead and after dark was able to escape from the vehicle. This small diary Jack acquired and from 11th May until June 1st 1940 he recorded daily their movements to the De Panne beach and arrival at Margate and safety.

Commemorated in perpetuity by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission
Wulpen Churchyard is located 5 km north east of Veurne, Belgium.

The British Expeditionary Force was involved in the later stages of the defence of Belgium following the German invasion in May 1940, and suffered many casualties in covering the withdrawal to Dunkirk.

Wulpen Churchyard contains 20 Commonwealth burials of the Second World War, six of them unidentified.
