

**Dr John Bernard Pulling (1887- 1959)** lived at Overton House, Marlborough St Faringdon (demolished in the 1970s to allow the expansion of the Faringdon Garage) He was a GP in Faringdon until he retired.

In 1915 he married Sybil C Grey. Their son William was born in 1916 and that is the year of Sybil's death. It is believed that she died in childbirth.

William wrote and kept a not entitled. "Father's last thoughts".

Dr Pulling's grandfather was the Rev W Pulling who was the rector of Eastnor (Ledbury, Herefordshire) for 35years, serving Lord and Lady Somers

Dr Pulling's only child was **Captain William John Grey Pulling** ( 23.10.1916 - 31.01.1984 )

William was educated at Malvern College, as was his father Dr Pulling. He was married in 1960 to Shirley Cook and they had no children. The latter years of his life were spent in Glasgow where he was a company director in an engineering firm
