Lord Berners  
Proposed tower at Faringdon Park.

With reference to the recent meeting of the sub-committee held at Faringdon to consider the above proposal, Lord Berners has now informed me that his intention is to build the tower within the trees, that any one standing on the roof of the tower, protected by its battlements, can see the view on all sides and it does not appear therefore that the tower will itself emerge from the trees. I have to-day heard from Lord Berners' Architect to the effect that the total height of the tower has been limited to 100 feet, the height of the trees being 95 feet. A meeting of the Regional Planning Committee is being held at these Offices on the 12th instant when the proposal will be considered by them and I thought you would like to have this information.
