**THE PEDESTRIAN CUT-THROUGHS AND CIRCULAR CYCLE ROUTE**

Whether you are walking to the shops, or exercising the dog, the cut-throughs shown on this map are a great way of getting around Faringdon linking generally quiet traffic-free roads. And if you've got a bicycle, why not use the suggested circular cycle route to get yourself around?

There are cycle racks at the top of Brewery Passage in Southampton Street car park, and cycle tethers at Barclays Bank in Market Place.

The Faringdon Community Bus operates a 'Hail and Ride' service, consult the FCB Timetable for full information on the route and times, copies available from the Tourist Information Centre.

## Out and about around Faringdon

Faringdon is ideal as a centre for visiting Oxford, The Cotswolds, Upper Thames and Vale of White Horse, each with its own distinct character and rich history. This map has been jointly prepared and financed by Vale of White Horse District Council, Faringdon Town Council, Faringdon Retail Group and Faringdon Chamber of Commerce



The historic town of Faringdon nestles upon the 'Golden Ridge' above the rich, flat farmlands of the Vale of White Horse, the oldest of the seventeen carved white horses in England.

The town has a long and varied history, with evidence of habitation by Prehistoric Man, Romans, Saxons, Normans and Vikings.

It suffered considerable damage between 1643-1646, during the Civil War. Consequently most of the buildings are of later date, but have remained barely unchanged for the past two centuries.

A prominent 'resting place' for travellers in the Coaching era, today's traveller will still find Faringdon a fascinating place to visit.

Faringdon offers some of the finest views across the Vale and Thames Valley, architecture of distinction and a rich history that is unparalleled.
